Serve on a standing committee...

- Community Assessment Committee gathers information about how well the county serves children birth to three years of age.
- Fatherhood Committee is a group of fathers in the EHS program who work together to plan fun activities for fathers to do with their children and support one another.
- Self-Assessment Committee is responsible for gathering information about the quality of our Early Head Start program each spring.
- Personnel Committee is responsible for interviewing and recommending staff to fill empty positions.
- Health Services Advisory Committee helps plan dental screenings and helps us offer other medical services that are useful to families.
- Recruitment and Enrollment Committee is responsible for setting procedures to recruit and retain families into the program.
- Family Activities Committee is responsible for planning activities for EHS program families.

Serve on the Policy Council...

- The Policy Council is a group of parents and other community members who meet monthly to discuss the vision of Early Head Start and how to make the program better.
